In today's gospel we hear about the love and care that the good Samaritan showed to the stranger he found on the road. For seafarers and fishers, Stella Maris is that good Samaritan. It has chaplains and volunteers in ports all over the world.

Concern for the welfare of the stranger, and the value of friendship to those who are far from home, is exactly the reason why Stella Maris, Apostleship of the Sea, was established over 100 years ago and today this has never been more relevant. In the last year more crews have been abandoned by their employers than ever before. Many seafarers are still being denied the right to leave their ships for even a short break away from the noise and pressure on board. Many are reporting more stress and worsening mental health and the war in Ukraine has added to crew shortages and shipping turmoil.
